JANUARY TO MARCH

Cadets took to the water early in the year at Spinnaker Sailing Club today, we ran a Powerboat Level 1 course, with continuation training for others. The first exercise of the day was an Ice Breaker – the surface of the lake was frozen!

Another group of Cadets took part in Sunday Racing at Spinnaker Sailing Club in January.

Two of our teams took the Southern Area 5-a-side football Competition in Woking, with the Junior Boys bringing home a Bronze Medal.



FEBRUARY

In February, Cadets represented T.S. Salisbury at the Wessex District Drill and Piping Competitions, held at HMS Excellent, Portsmouth. The standard was from Units across the District, and we came away with some great results:

MARCH

In March we ran a Basic Seamanship Specialisation course at the Unit. With a mix of Royal Marine Cadets and Sea Cadets attending the course.

All Cadets learn Seamanship skills as part of their Core Training; the training provides basic skills in the safe handling of ropes, basic Bends and Hitches (knot tying) ranging from securing a boat alongside a pontoon to decorative knots and knowing what knot to use for different situations.



APRIL – JUNE

APRIL

We returned to Spinnaker Sailing Club in April, with lots of activities on the water for the Cadets. These visits included; Sailing, Stand-up Paddleboarding, Powerboating, Fixed Seat Rowing, and Sliding Seat Rowing.

The rowers picked up their Go Row 1 qualifications while the sailors were refreshing their skills ahead of camp.



MAY

Teams from the Unit took part in the Wessex District Boat Handling Competition held at Southampton Unit in May. The Teams had been practicing hard in the lead up to the competition and their efforts were rewarded with some great results.

Cadets from the Unit competed in the Wessex District Rowing Competition at Portsmouth in June. T.S. Salisbury's crews were entered into every category available and were up against some very competitive crews from around Wessex District. We came away with seven 1st places and two 2nd places.

JULY

Cadets were back on the water in July at Spinnaker Sailing Club, with the more experienced sailors were using Spinnakers (Symmetrical and Asymmetrical) for the first time. Meanwhile a few of our newer sailors were in our RS Zests

We also ran another windsurfing course for Sea Cadets Whale Island Boat Station, with Cadets from Bognor Regis, Bournemouth, Littlehampton, Portsmouth, and Ryde Units.



AUGUST

We held an 80's themed party at the Unit in August, with cadets attending in fancy dress and 80's outfits. They also took part in an A-Z scavenger hunt and an 80's themed quiz.

We were also back at Spinnaker club again in August, this time we were Paddle boarding, Sailing, power boating, and wind surfing.

Junior Sea Cadets also spent time working on their Green Module, learning about fire lighting and toasting marshmallows.



SEPTEMBER

Four of our Cadets participated in the National Sailing and Windsurfing Regatta held in Southport, Merseyside in September. With 4 volunteers from the Unit involved with the Team running the event.
